Through our grassroots initiatives and affiliations, we empower people to protect waters locally so their communities can SWIM, DRINK, and FISH forever from coast to coast to coast.







Broadcast Viewing Details

- The broadcast will be approximately 45 minutes
- In order to fully participate, you will need two screens. One screen to watch the broadcast from, and one screen or mobile device to bid from
- Screen #1. Watch the broadcast. First, open the personalized link emailed to you. To enjoy the full experience, we recommend watching on as large of a screen as possible. If you can, share your computer screen onto a television or projector
- We recommend downloading Zoom before the event and ask that you please check to ensure you have a strong, reliable internet connection in advance of the event. If your Wi-Fi is not reliable, connect using an Ethernet cable
- Screen #2. Auction bidding. Set up your bidding profile on www.givergy.ca/artistsforwater in order to bid on the Art Auction or to make a donation. Be sure to register in advance of the event to avoid delays

How to Bid and Donate

- Head to givergy.ca/artistsforwater
- Use the top-left menu to view the Art Auction, access My Bids or Make a Donation
- To bid, select an item, enter your amount and then click 'Place Bid'.
 Use the 'Max Bid' function and the system will bid for you up to the
 amount entered
- Register your details and then 'Confirm Your Bid'
- Receive outbid text notifications and bid again!
- To register a bid, the bidder will be required to provide their name, contact information, and credit card information





Our Initiatives

Community-Based Water Monitoring Initiatives have been supported by Swim Drink Fish for 20 years. Fraser Riverkeeper and Lake Ontario Waterkeeper act as the anchor hubs in Canada, inspiring water monitoring hubs in Edmonton, AB (run by North Saskatchewan Riverkeeper), and hubs in Lake-Erie Niagara, Zhiibaahaasing First Nation, and Kingston.

The hubs connect communities to their waters, empower citizen scientists to collect and share water quality results with you through Swim Guide. The information we collect and share creates opportunities to resolve local water quality concerns and restore swimmable, drinkable, fishable water.

Watermark Project is a community-created archive with true stories about impacts waterbodies have left on those that love them.

Great Lakes Guide connects you with outdoor destinations and activities across the Great Lakes, helping you find new places to unleash your inner explorer.

Great Lakes Challenge, made possible by the generosity of the Weston Family Foundation, collaborates with Great Lakes communities to develop and implement iconic restoration projects.

Swim Guide is the world's most comprehensive beach information service, having helped over 6-million people find beaches, check water quality reports, and report pollution for over 8,000 beaches in 11 countries.



The Swim Drink Fish movement is making a difference:

Over the last year...

- **6 million people** used our guides to find places to swim, hike, and spend more time outside last year
- 800+ people participated in water awareness workshops and training activities
- Over 3,000 water samples were collected in 20 places
- 30 km² of habitat was restored in 9 communities
- New rules were supported to protect fisheries, access and navigation, beaches, data sharing, and to prevent sewage and plastics pollution
- 6 water monitoring hubs were established



Auction Information & Rules

Payment

Payment for successful bidders will be processed immediately after the auction's end. Swim Drink Fish accepts MasterCard, Visa, and American Express. Auction items will not be released to the buyer until payment has been received in full.

There is no tax or buyer's premium added to the hammer price of any of the artwork.

Charitable Tax Receipt

Auction buyers will receive a charitable tax receipt for the difference between the value and the final bid, only if the final bid exceeds 125% of the value of the item.

The Fine Print

Any bid entered is binding. All sales are final. No purchase can be returned, refunded or exchanged. All property is sold as exhibited. Swim Drink Fish is not responsible for acts or omissions of carriers or packers. If a dispute arises after the auction, the Swim Drink Fish record of the auction proceedings shall be conclusive. Each auction item carries an estimated market value obtained from sources that Swim Drink Fish believes to be reliable, but no representation or warranty as to the actual resale value of any work being auctioned is made or implied. The estimated value is intended as a guide to assist you in your bidding.



Shipping

Location for all artwork is indicated on the artist page on the www.givergy.ca/artistsforwater site.

With the exception of Dana Claxton, Dawna Mueller, and Tyler Toews, all works of art are located in Toronto.

Arrangements for delivery/shipping of works located in Toronto may be made with Museumpros Art Services and for works in Vancouver, with Denbigh Fine Art Services. Any delivery charges incurred are the responsibility of the successful bidder. Before the artwork is released, the buyer must obtain a receipt from Swim Drink Fish.

All packing and shipping services, including insurance, must be arranged directly with Museumpros or Denbigh. Swim Drink Fish is not liable for any damage sustained during packing and shipping.
